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A. PLAR fees

Fees for PLAR challenges are set to cover our costs for consultation, assessment, and related administrative tasks. PLAR fees are non-refundable and non-transferrable.

The PLAR fees policy is subject to change for each new academic year. Please see the **Cost** section on the PLAR webpage for current fee information.

B. PLAR eligibility and options

To be eligible for PLAR in this program, you must have an unincumbered license in a Canadian jurisdiction.

- Licensure with the College of Registered Nurses of Saskatchewan (CRNS) as an RN(AAP) requires the successful completion of the following courses, in sequential order:
 - 1. NURS 225 Health Assessment
 - 2. PHAR 271 Clinical Drug Therapy
 - 3. NURS 1679 Clinical Decision Making for Additional Authorized Practice
- PLAR is available for NURS 225 and PHAR 271 only.
- Once successfully completed via PLAR or course work, students may enroll in NURS 1679.

Please note: Students who apply for PLAR and are not successful but still want to obtain the designation will be required to register and complete the course in which they were unsuccessful.

C. Dates when PLAR assessment is available

PLAR assessment for this program is available from Sept 1 to May 1 in each academic year.

All PLAR assessment must be completed by May 1 of each academic year.

D. Special directions for this program

- 1. Review the PLAR process and FAQs and the information in this guide.
- 2. Self-rate your learning using the Course Outlines in this guide.
- Consult with the PLAR contact person for PLAR approval. Be prepared to provide your resume, course selfratings (see <u>section F</u>), and a partially completed PLAR application. If you are approved for PLAR, the contact person will sign your PLAR application and explain next steps.
- 4. Submit the following items to <u>cnpp@saskpolytech.ca</u>:
 - a. Completed Self-rating course outline for the course you are applying to PLAR
 - b. Partially completed <u>PLAR application form</u>
 - c. Updated Resume/CV
- 5. **Pay** the required registration fee. If you are approved for PLAR, your application will be sent to <u>Enrolment</u> <u>Services</u> and you will be registered in the appropriate course. You will receive email confirmation of the registration and will be required to pay the course fees.
- 6. **Complete** assessment requirements within 8 weeks* of registration.
 - Students will be provided access with in 24 hours of being registered to the course content.
 - Students will arrange with the assigned faculty the assessment date(s).
 - All other information will be provided in the online course materials.

*Non-completion will constitute a failure and the student will be required to complete the regular course offering to obtain credit.
