




PD ENGAGEMENT BY COMPETENCY

Curriculum **Development** The **UDL Institute** welcomed 75 participants from Saskatchewan Polytechnic, and from universities and colleges across North America. This two-day event broadened the understanding of UDL by incorporating discussions on Indigenization, technology, and accessibility.

Guest Speakers included Adam Finkelstein (McGill) who shared how to build inclusive physical and digital learning environments; Julie Maier (USask) helped us move from accommodations to accessibility in digital contexts; Lisa Fanelli and Karrie L. Morin (Goodwin University) revealed how applying a UDL and OER Framework would help us achieve accessible course design; and, Jeni Dulek, Alyssa Phillips, Jenae Wadleigh, and Michelle Gorenberg (Pacific University) showed us the impact of neuro-normative bias within educational systems, and what we as educators can do about it.

The second day workshop was lead by Learning Technology trainers and combined short presentations with hands-on applications of UDL principles in Brightspace, Zoom, Kaltura (videos) PowerPoint, Word and PDF documents.
