2008/09 continuing education calendar lists hundreds of distance education options

July 8, 2008 – From accounting to writing your life story and everything in between, SIAS's new continuing education calendar really does have something for everyone. The calendar lists almost 1,100 courses, of which more than 370 are available via distance education.

In choosing personal and professional development courses from the new calendar, students are able to learn in a variety of ways that work around their busy schedules. Students can take a single course or work toward certificate or diploma completion either after-hours, at home or online. Registration is already under way.

The courses allow adult learners to further develop personal interests, upgrade their skills, gain training in new fields or change careers without having to take time off work. Distance options help them balance family and work responsibilities. The calendar offers a comprehensive view of the courses offered by program area and then by campus, making it fast and simple to find courses. And the rapidly growing number of people enrolled show just how successful flexible learning options really are.

"SIAS has experienced significant enrolment growth in courses offered by non-traditional means in recent years," says David Francis, academic director for SIAS's Virtual Campus. "Total registrations in online courses, courses offered via SCN and print-distance courses exceeded 11,000 in the past academic year."

SIAS's continuing education calendar provides information on courses offered through the organization's four campuses. The calendar highlights numerous courses offered in the following areas: Academic Upgrading, Agriculture, Applied/Visual Media, Business, Career Transition Programs and Services, Community/Human Services, Computer Training, Engineering Technology, Health Services, Hospitality/Foods Services, Industrial/Trades, Natural Resources, Nursing, Personal Interest, Recreation/Tourism, Science and Technology.
