A. PLAR fees

Fees for PLAR challenges are set to cover our costs for consultation, assessment, and related administrative tasks. PLAR fees are non-refundable and non-transferrable.

B. PLAR eligibility and options

To be eligible for PLAR for courses in this program, you must first apply for admission and be accepted into the program. You must also consult with the PLAR contact person and be approved for PLAR assessment.

Course prerequisites and corequisites

Some courses have one or more other courses that must be completed first (prerequisite) or at the same time (corequisite). See course outlines in this guide to identify any pre- or co-requisites for each course. Discuss with your PLAR contact person how to deal with courses with corequisites.

Block assessment

Some programs may assess a cluster of courses together in one block, which may save you time and effort. Ask the PLAR contact person whether there are any block assessment options in this program.

PLAR assessment for this program is available from Sept 1 to June 15 in each academic year.

All PLAR assessments must be completed by June 15 of each academic year.

- 5. **Register** for PLAR at Registration/Enrolment Services once you have signed approval on your PLAR Application Form. The PLAR fee will be added to your student account.
- 6. **Finalize** an assessment plan with your assigned assessor.
- 7. **Complete** assessment before your PLAR registration expires.

You will study skin diseases and disorders to assist you in selecting the most beneficial skin care products to suit the skin condition.
