Students from Sask Polytech’s Retail Meat Specialist applied certificate program are putting their new skills to work, offering a changing selection of meat cuts, sausages, bacon, ham and oven-ready meals.

The Retail Meat Specialist applied certificate is the first step to becoming a journey person meat cutter. In this 22-week program, students develop the skills to become a successful meat cutter. Areas of study include food safety, muscle and skeletal structures, as well as preparation of pork, beef, lamb and poultry. Other topics include curing and smoking meats, merchandising seafood, value-added oven-ready products and sanitation.
