What is a Saskatchewan Health Card?

A Saskatchewan Health Card, also referred to as provincial health card, allows holder to access universal health benefits. Please refer to eHealth website for detailed information on these benefits: Health Benefits Coverage | Prescription Drug Plans and Health Coverage | Government of Saskatchewan

Once an international student resides in Saskatchewan and is enrolled full-time, they are eligible to apply for a Saskatchewan Health Card. Students must register themselves, including their accompanying spouse/partner and dependents (if applicable).

Note:

Enrolled refers to students whose program already started and already attending. Accepted refers to students admitted to a program but are **expected to be enrolled** in future intake.

An accepted student whose program has not started is not eligible to apply for Saskatchewan Health Card. It is strongly recommended that students arrange an insurance that will cover for the time in Canada until covered by SK health card.

Eligible students moving to Saskatchewan may have SK health coverage beginning on the first day of the third month following the date they established residency in Saskatchewan.

How to Apply

Student must provide one (1) document for each criteria – two (2) set of documents in total (front and back if applicable):

- Signed rental, or lease agreement
- Utility Bill (home telephone, cable TV, satellite TV, water, gas, or energy)
 - cell phone bills are not accepted

- Saskatchewan Motor Vehicle Registration
- Employer record (pay stub or letter from employer on company letterhead)
- School, college, or university report card or transcript

Enrolment Verification Ordering

Order via your mySaskPolytech account; it posts the same day!

Ensure your **permanent address is up to date (i.e. reflects your Canadian address) prior to ordering**

Update your address through the Enrolment Services card on your MySaskPolytech Click on 'Update address and personal information'

To Order:

- Log in to your mySaskPolytech Account
- Navigate to the Enrolment Services card on the Students page
- Click on Enrolment Verification
- **Select term**; if you are registered in more than one term, submit a separate request for each term
- Select your address from the dropdown menu, then click continue; delivery method of Digital is the only choice; click continue
- Click on **submit request**

Within the same business day, your enrolment verification will be posted to your myElectronicLetters in the Enrolment Services card on your Students page.





2. Enter your name, valid email address and create a password. Please read and check terms of privacy policy. Then click "Submit".







Note: Student will be responsible to ensure they have insurance coverage during the gap. We highly recommend carrying a medical insurance from the time of travel to Canada until covered thru SK health card.

SK Health Card Coverage

The following health services are fully covered by Saskatchewan Health:

All medically necessary services provided by physicians (inpatient/outpatient):

- Includes family doctors and specialists
- Walk in clinics
- Emergency room visits
- Hospitalization (as recommended by physician)
- Maternity care
- Some immunization services.
- Mental health services via the Saskatchewan Health Authority.

There is no coverage for the following:

- Prescription drugs
- Routine dental services such as cleanings, scalings, fillings, etc.
- Ground ambulance transportation
- Air ambulance
- Eye glasses, lensesMedical appliances
- Most paramedical services such as psychologists, naturopaths, acupuncturists, registered massage therapists, etc.

Extending your Coverage

The expiry of your SK health card generally coincides with the expiry date of your temporary resident status (study/work permit). Remember to extend your coverage every time you apply for study permit extension or post-grad work permit (PGWP).

When to apply for the implied coverage

You are expected to apply for study permit extension or post-grad work permit, while you hold a valid study permit.

To maintain your SK Health Card coverage with a one-time implied status for six (6) months, you must apply within 30 days before your coverage expires.

Your application may not be accepted if applying too early (more than 30 days before expiry) or too late (after the expiry date of SK health card).

 - A completed study permit extension with proof of submission to IRCC
 - A proof of payment for the study permit extension

After the student receives the original study permit extension from IRCC, they must follow the above steps (Update or Replace a Health Card) to extend the coverage to the same duration as the study permit.

After the student receives the original work permit from IRCC, they must follow the above steps (Update or Replace a Health Card) to extend the coverage to the same duration as the work permit.

FAQs

Q: If my student study permits is about to expire, how will this affect my Saskatchewan Health Card coverage?

A: International students automatically lose their Health Card coverage when their study permit expires.

Q: What if International Students do not have Health Cards? How will this affect their ability to access medical attention?

A: Students will have to pay for any medical expenses or maintain medical insurance coverage.

Q: If international students do not have Health Cards, will they receive Health Card coverage immediately upon application?

A: No. Health Card coverage is only available once students receive their Health Cards. Application is not a guarantee of coverage.

Q: If international students pay for medical expenses prior to receiving their Saskatchewan Health Cards, can they be reimbursed for those medical expenses after receiving their Health Cards?

A: International students that have applied for a Saskatchewan Health Card but have not received it will have to pay for any medical expenses they incur. Students may keep all receipts and submit them to eHealth after receiving their Saskatchewan Health Card; however, there is no guarantee that their expenses will be reimbursed. If the student is facing a life-threatening medical emergency, they can contact eHealth and request to have their application brought to the front of the line for review.

Q: What coverage is provided to international students with a Saskatchewan Health Card?

A: The same coverage as Saskatchewan domestic residents. Please refer to the following website for details about domestic universal health benefits:

When submitting receipts for reimbursement, the original receipt(s) should be submitted. Keep a copy of all receipts for your own records. Additionally, the following information should be included when you submit a request:

- Saskatchewan Health Card Number or a photocopy of the actual health card
- The name of the doctor
- All services rendered for each receipt being submitted (an itemized statement)
- The reason for the doctor visit as indicated on the receipt or invoice
