* Hyflex – A blended approach where students have the option to join class on campus or from any location via a remote learning platform like Zoom. Students will join class in a consistent method.
* Online – Students study prepared materials online in a self-paced manner while keeping pace with the course schedule as indicated. No requirement for live attendance except for examinations.

Chartered Professionals in Human Resources (CPHR) Saskatchewan is the granting body for the Chartered Professional in Human Resources (CPHR) designation within the province. CPHR Saskatchewan recognizes the Saskatchewan Polytechnic Business diploma in Human Resources as an accredited post-secondary program.

Graduates with an overall cumulative average of 70% or higher may be eligible to apply for a waiver for the National Knowledge Exam (NKE).
