Business Diploma Specialty: Municipal Administration

The municipal administration specialty prepares students for leadership roles in municipal governance by equipping them with the skills needed to manage the daily operations of towns and municipalities. Developed in partnership with key industry organizations, this program provides applied learning at the diploma level to prepare graduates for senior government management positions.

Students gain expertise in human resources, municipal law, strategic communication, project management, accounting, and risk management. With ten specialized courses tailored to municipal administration, graduates are well-prepared for rewarding careers in local government.
